NORWICH - The 29th incarnation of the Greater Norwich Chamber of Commerce Norwich Auto Show added planes and trains to its traditional display of classic, retro and custom compact cars.

And organizers say there were fewer cars on display this year because of rainy weather.

"People don't like bringing their cars out in the rain," event chairman Dave Wigfield said. He said there were about 400 cars at the show, down from previous years because of the sporadic rain.

The planes and trains that were added to the mix this year were small-scale versions brought to the show by the Salem-based RC Propbusters club and the Central Connecticut G Gaugers Module Group, respectively.

But some of those little aircraft have a lot of juice, according to RC Propbusters member Ed Deming.

His Goblin helicopter soared upright and upside down on the Dodd Stadium baseball field, shrieking skyward with a 13-horsepower motor and a battery capable of 15 to 16 kilowatts.

"You almost can't believe physics is actually working," Deming said as he came off the field with the \$2,500 helicopter that had hovered in an inverted position so close to the ground it looked like the rotors were going to trim the grass.

This is the first year that the group has joined forces with the Norwich Auto Show. Member Fred Meyer Jr. said it's an opportunity for the 77-year-old club to generate buzz.

Deming and Meyer are engineers whose interest in science was fostered by their participation in the remote control airplane club as children. When Meyer joined in 1942, he said the planes were a much lower-tech proposition. "You started the engine, let it go, and chased it wherever the wind took it," he said. Now, Meyer said the batteries in the aircraft are capable of 200 amps, an amount that would "blow every breaker in your house" if it coursed through at once.
